# Salisbury Museum, Landscape Open 2025 Exhibition 18<sup>th</sup> October – 25<sup>th</sup> January

The exhibition accompanying Salisbury Museum's open Landscape competition is now on, with a diverse range of landscapes reflecting the multifaceted relationships artists have to place, and the range of talented artists working in the genre. 80 artworks have been selected from nearly 2,000 works that were submitted. The open feels like the logical next step which will celebrate the best contemporary work inspired by this genre.'
